SUGGESTED GUIDELINES FOR BUBBLER USE

Also known as "ICE-AWAYS" these technologies are used to prevent property damange by inhibiting the formation of ice around docks, boathouses and shorelines,

At Healey Lake, we are regulated Federally, Provincially, and Municipally. At present, each jurisdiction has a bit of legislation pertinent to bubblers, but for now, there are no comprehensive, general guidelines or regulations. We believe that the vast majority of property owners are unaware of what the use of a bubbler system is doing by unnaturally creating open water, nor are they aware of the DANGER TO THE PUBLIC AND THE LEGAL REPERCUSSIONS.

Section 236 (1), Ontario Criminal Code.

"Every one who makes or causes to be made an opening in ice...is under a legal duty to guard it in a manner that is adequate to prevent persons from falling in by accident and is adequate to warn them that the opening exists."

Unlike Muskoka, Healey Lake does not have many manmade structures in the water, except for docks. We believe that a cooperative local effort is the preferred approach to meeting everyone's needs and providing local leadership for this issue.

At a minimum, residents who use bubblers should be advised of and adhere to the following guidelines.

- Do not turn the bubbler on too early; most places do not need bubbling action until late in the winter.
- Install a timer so the bubbler is only running part time, like at night during the green energy cycle.
- For safety, the water should not be open further than 4-10 feet around a boathouse or dock.
- A steady or pulsing amber light is suggested as it shows well and can't be confused with a taillight.
 Strobe lights are not only annoying, but they also cause severe light trespass issues.
- ALWAYS prominently display a large sign reading, WARNING OPEN WATER.
- Bubbler functions should be checked weekly.





I have a report on the dam. The MNR&F has come down with the following - there was an apparent "miscommunication " in that there was an engineering report done, plans to construct structures downstream and upstream to improve the integrity and this was to be done this summer and this fall. The MNR&F is conducting Hydro test and calculations. While there is no plans as yet for this construction, we are very much on their radar. I will continue to monitor and enquire as to any change in status.

Just a reminder, that if you see a fire, do not call 911, please call 310 FIRE to report.

Residents will be receiving a questionnaire asking for your input regarding site alteration. This bylaw is in the planning stages and your thoughts and opinions are important to the creation of said bylaw. Please take the time to comment.

Come spring, there will be two speed signs, while these signs do not take pictures and issue tickets, they do collect data on volume and speeds. These signs re needed as Healey Lake Road has seen speeds as high as 110 kph.

Our abandoned dock program was a huge success and will be repeated next year, if required. Many thanks to all involved.

The Township is talking to Massassauga Park to have sufficient parking for their campers and keep camper's cars out of Pine Bay lot.

A SUCCESSFUL SUMMER FOR LOONS ON HEALEY

As summer turns to fall, (and we await the arrival of winter) and we prepare to bid adieu to the serene days at our cherished cottages and to our resident loons. With a late start I was unsure of the reproductive success we would have on our lake. There were less sightings, less courting, calling and territory battles this season but I am so happy to report that two out of the three pairs of loons had two chicks each. The pair near the marinas didn't nest for the first time in 5 summers since I have been reporting. While both pairs did lose one chick along the way, the good news is that both remaining loon chicks have now made it to migration, marking a significant achievement in our wildlife conservation efforts.

The successful breeding and migration of these loon families are not just heartening but also a testament to the beauty of the ecosystem we are privileged to share.

GOOD SIGNS FOR LOONS ON HEALEY LAKE

Canadian Lakes Loon Survey monitoring of loon reproductive success has proven effective for monitoring broader lake health. In fact, survival of loon chicks is a good indicator of the impact of lake acidification and other water conditions on fish stocks and aquatic life.

Birds Canada states the loon population has been decreasing over the years. This has been determined from data gathered for over 30 years from the Annual Loon Survey across Canada. We continue to participate in the loon survey annually.

Human disturbance and development are ongoing threats to loons. There are many things that are detrimental to loons, including: disturbance of nesting sites, entanglement in discarded debris, lead poisoning, nest predation and displacement of loons through habitat loss.

We had an issue with an adult loon demonstrating the behaviour indicative of lead poisoning. This loon stayed bobbing at the rocky waters edge for hours, going in and out of sleep. This behaviour can be seen from molting loons too, however, this loon was only just beginning his molt. Unfortunately by the time the representative from Bird Studies came to investigate the situation, we could not find the loon again.

Lead is dull and grey in colour. It will leave a mark when scratched on paper. Lead is invisible to wildlife! Lead tackle is ingested by loons and other aquatic birds in different ways. Loons intentionally swallow small stones to help digest their food, and small lead sinkers and split shot, lost by anglers on lake bottoms look just like natural pebbles, except they're poisonous.

Your commitment to preserving our environment and wildlife is truly appreciated - Please take a moment to go through your old tackle boxes and remove any lead tackle for a cleaner and safer lake.

HEALEY LAKE FIRE PROTECTION

The Township of the Archipelago and other nearby municipalities do not provide fire protection of any kind for the Healey Lake area. Although there is a fire station in MacTier, this is operated by the Township of Georgian Bay and cottagers should not expect them to respond to a fire on Healey Lake.

The Healey Lake Property Owners Association does not offer a firefighting service; however, we have made available 11 gasoline powered, high pressure water pumps at various locations on the lake. These 11 courtesy pumps may be accessed and used by cottage members or their representatives to assist in fighting fires at their own risk.

Please be aware that the water pumps and associated equipment are provided on a "best efforts" basis and the Association assumes no responsibility for their reliability or for injuries to anyone using this equipment.

The pumps are stored in boxes that contain the pumps, hoses and a set of operating instructions. The Association occasionally puts on an annual demonstration of the use of the pumps at the Regatta or an Annual General Meeting.

The water pumps may be borrowed from the end of April to late October when they are removed for winter storage.

FOUR OF THE PUMPS ARE IN PLACE YEAR ROUND

To the best of our ability, we try to make sure all our pumps are gassed up and ready for use when needed. After a fire pump has been used, it is important to notify John Mendicino at 705-321-2203 or john.mendico@gmail.com



THE LAKED CHEF

- RON HUTZUL -

GUINNESS & WHISKEY STEW

Prep Time: 15 Minutes | Cook Time: 2 hours | Serves 4-6
This dish is hearty and full of rich flavours — perfect after chopping wood or a day spent sledding out on the trails!


INGREDIENTS

- ☐ 2-1/2 lb Beef Blade Steak or Blade Pot Roast
- 1 large sweet onion, diced
- 4 strips bacon, diced
- 2 Tbsp minced garlic
- ☐ 4 carrots, peeled and sliced into 1/2-inch pieces
- ☐ 3 stalks of celery, sliced into 1/2-inch pieces
- ☐ 4 Tbsp all-purpose flour
- 2 cans Guinness Stout (500mL)
- ☐ ½ cup Irish Whiskey
- 2 cups beef broth
- 2 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- ☐ 3 Tbsp tomato paste
- ☐ ½ tsp dried thyme
- 2 bay leaves
- ☐ Olive Oil, Salt & Pepper

DIRECTIONS

- 1) Preheat oven to 325°F. Cut meat into bite-sized cubes. Pat dry and season with salt and pepper.
- 2) Heat 2 tbsp of the oil in a heavy Dutch oven or stock pot over medium-high heat. Add cubed beef in batches and brown well on all sides. Remove each batch to a plate.
- 3) Lower heat to medium and add oil to just coat the pan. Add onions and cook for 2 minutes. Add bacon and cook until bacon is browned and onions are soft and golden. Add garlic, cook for one minute (stir constantly to prevent burning). Add carrot and celery. Sprinkle flour over top of the veggies, then stir for 2-3 minutes until flour is cooked off (it'll stick to the veggies).
- 4) Stir in Guinness, Whiskey, beef broth, Worcestershire, tomato paste and bay leaves; scrape up any browned bits at the bottom of the pot. Return beef and any accumulated juices to the pot (note: liquid level should just cover the beef and vegetables).
- 5) Cover and cook in the preheated oven for 2 hours, until beef is fork-tender. Skim off any fat on the surface, if desired. Adjust salt and pepper to taste. Remove bay leaves.

I serve this with fluffy mashed potatoes, (lots of butter and cream) but it works well over extra broad egg noodles. Be sure to have bread available to sop up the gravy!!
